Contents



With this scenery you get the 12 “Tongass National Forest Recreation Cabins” on Prince of Wales Island, left out in Misty and Tongass. So you will have all Tongass National Forest cabins on this island. In addition there are 2 small campsites and a parking area to start a canoe tour.

For placing the cabins, the campsites and the parking area, I used the descriptions and maps of “The Tongass National Forest Recreation Cabins” website and Topo map.

For each cabin I created a simple AFCAD file, to have a starting point at the cabins. As the cabins don’t have an official ICAO code, I took a fictional Code: “MC<number>” If the starting point doesn’t fit with your needs, you can change this with Lee Swordys AFCAD tool.

For those, who have FsCargo installed, cargo areas are provided.

Please have in mind, that the FsCargo areas might be a little bit misplaced on your system. It depends on the settings. With the Cargo Editor you can easily correct this.

Apart from my scenery you will find a Patch for Lake Galea (Honker Lake Cabin) made by Holger Sandmann. It makes the lake flat.

Requirements



This scenery is an addition **only for Misty- and Tongass Fjords (FS2004)** by **FSAddon**.

So you **MUST HAVE** installed both sceneries.

Without “Tongass Fjords” you will see nothing!

If you only have “Tongass Fjords” installed, the cabins in the south-eastern part of Prince of Wales Island (covered by “Misty Fjords”) will not show up correctly.

Also required is “**Freight Dogs – The Scenery**” by **FSAddon** .

If it is not installed on your computer, you will miss some smaller objects (fireplaces, the campsites, and the outhouse toilet)

No additional libraries are needed.



How to find the cabins



First you can use the map of Prince of Wales Island, which comes with “Tongass Fjords” to find your way. But not all of the National Forest cabins can be found there and sometimes the map does not show the correct location.

For closer information go to the National Forest website www.fs.fed.us/r10/tongass/cabins/pow_map.shtml.

You will find a map with all cabins. With left-click on the cabins name you will get all information for that specific cabin, including a small chart of their vicinity.



The Cabins



- MC01** **Salmon Bay Lake Cabin**
- MC02** **Red Bay Lake Cabin**
- MC03** **Shiple Bay Cabin**
- MC04** **Sarkar Lake Cabin**
- MC05** **Sweetwater Lake Cabin** (parking area for starting canoe tours at the south end of the lake; sometimes they burn fires there too)
- MC06** **Honker Lake Cabin** (On some charts Honker Lake is named "**Lake Galea**")!
- MC07** **Staney Creek Cabin** (with Horseshoe Hole and Staney Bridge Campsites)
- MC08** **Salmon Lake Cabin**
- MC09** **Karta lake Cabin**
- MC10** **Karta River Cabin** (Watch out, landing on Karta River can be dangerous!)
- MC11** **Trollers Cove Cabin**
- MC12** **Josephine Lake Cabin**

Installation




1. The folder “MC_Prince Of Wales” goes to the FS9/Addon Scenery folder. Add it to the FS9 scenery library, placed above Tongass and Misty Fjords.
2. Start FS9, do nothing and just close the program again. Now the scenery.cfg should be updated.
3. Go to the FS9 main folder and open the scenery.cfg with a text editor. Search for the entry “MC_Prince Of Wales”.

Copy and paste the lines from “Flatten.txt” under the MC_Prince Of Wales entry. It should look like this:

(where „XXX“ is the number in your scenery.cfg)

4. Put the content of the folder AFCAD (12 Af2.bgl files, MC01 – MC12) into the Folder FS9/Addon Scenery/Scenery, or where you usually place them.



5. Installation of the patch for Lake Galea

Open the zip file “0_TF_water_W3_Lake_Galea_patch_LWM2.zip”.
Inside you will find a bgl file with the same name.

This bgl has to go to the scenery folder within **Tongass Fjords Scenery** (NOT Tongass Fjords Landscape)

So this will be the path:
FS9/FSAddon/Tongass Fjords Scenery/Scenery

6. For users of FsCargo only

If you have the payware program “FsCargo” by FS-ADDON installed, and you want your cabins to be supplied with people, camping gear, or fuel for the stove,
Go to FS9/Vistamare/FsCargo
open the folder “FsCargo” and
put the “Cra1Prince of Wales.CFG” into FS9/Vistamare/FsCargo/Worlds

7. Close this document, start your weather machine, fire up FS9, grab a floatplane and takeoff.

Known Issue: Two smoke emissions coming out of the roof of the Salmon Lake cabin.
This very old cabin is unique. I tried to preserve a little bit of the impression for that cabin.
So I assembled two cabins for this one. This is the reason for the two smoke effects. You will have to live with it, as I cannot fix this.

I hope you have as much fun, as I had creating this thing.
Happy Cabin-flying! “But the weather...” ☺
